### Infantino threatens broadcast blackout

Geneva: Publicly criticising broadcasters for offering too little to screen the Women's World Cup has not worked out yet for Fifa president Gianni Infantino, who is now threatening a blackout in some major European markets.

Infantino intensified a public standoff that started last October with a warning late on Monday to five key countries — England, France, Germany, Italy, Spain — in a statement published less than three months before the tournament starts in Australia and New Zealand.

"To be very clear, it is our moral and legal obligation not to undersell the Fifa Women's World Cup," Infantino said of the July 20-August 20 tournament.

"Therefore, should the offers continue not to be fair (towards women and women's football), we will be forced not to broadcast the Fifa Women's World Cup into the Big 5 European countries," he said.

Infantino first aired the issue seven months ago, when in Auckland for the official draw for the 32-team tournament, saying that offers as low as 1 per cent of the TV rights price paid for the men's World Cup were "not acceptable."

In March, Infantino reported no progress with TV broadcasters while also announcing that he would increase in team prize money to \$110 million for the tournament. Infantino has been clearly ranked that player-led criticism of Fifa was offering equal prize money is amplified by the media.

## Iwobi earns draw in relegation thriller

Leicester: Leicester City and Everton remain deep in relegation trouble after slugging out a 2-2 draw in a gripping basement battle at a raucous King Power Stadium on Monday.

Dominic Calvert-Lewin's first goal since October, a penalty in the 15th minute, put Everton ahead but Leicester equalised seven minutes later when Caizer Soyuncu fired home.

Jamie Vardy's clinical finish gave Leicester the lead in the 33rd minute before a manic end to the opening half in which Everton missed two open goals and Leicester playmaker James Maddison had a penalty saved by Jordan Pickford.

Alex Iwobi dragged Everton level with a volley nine minutes into the second half and both sides strove for the winner that would have given their survival hopes a huge boost.

In the end they both had

to settle for a point which was more welcome for Leicester who moved out of the relegation zone and up to 16th place with 30 points from 34 games.

While Leicester moved up a couple of places, they remain in grave peril in a relegation battle likely to go the wire.

Everton, who have not been out of the top flight for 69

If ever there was a relegation six-pointer it was the clash between the sides occupying 15th and 16th places in the table and the contest crackled with intensity throughout to keep a fired-up crowd on the edge of their seats.

Everton, now without a win in 13 away games, began full of energy and Iwobi was denied by a superb Daniel Iversen save.

Calvert-Lewin, Everton's often forgotten striker due to his long spells in the treatment room, then put his side ahead with a clinical penalty after being nudged over by Timothy Castagne. Everton's lead was short-lived though as their defence failed miserably to deal with a set piece and Soyuncu half-volleyed past Pickford while slipping over.

The roof lifted off the stadium when Everton conceded possession and Maddison spotted veteran Vardy's run with an exquisite pass and the ever-reliable striker coolly rounded Pickford to put his side ahead.

### Mixed day for India pugilists

Tashkent: Tokyo Olympian Ashish Chaudhary advanced to the 90kg pre-quarter finals with a split decision win over Meysam Ghesghlaghi of Iran at the Men's World Boxing Championships here on Tuesday.

Ashish secured a hard-fought 4-1 victory against the former Asian Championships silver medalist.

The 28-year-old from Himachal Pradesh displayed his attacking intent from the word go by landing powerful jabs to keep his opponent at bay in the first round.

Silver medalist at the 2019 Asian Championships, Ashish then utilised his technical ability to edge past the Iranian. He will now face a tough challenge from two-time Olympic champion Arlen Lopez of Cuba in the Round of 16.

Among other bouts, debutant Harsh Choudhary bowled out after suffering a 0-5 loss against Billy McAllister of Australia in the 80kg category.

On Monday, double Commonwealth winner Ganes bronze medalist Mohammad Husamuddin (57kg) advanced to Round II.

## Tsitsipas outlasts 'cheetah' Baez

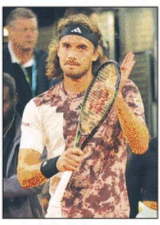
Madrid: Stefanos Tsitsipas felt his rival was as fast as a cheetah on centre court at the Madrid Open.

Point after point, his opponent Sebastian Baez kept chasing down balls to stay in contention in the third-round match.

The third-seeded Tsitsipas came through in the clutch moments, though, earning a 7-5, 3-6, 6-3 win over the 31st-ranked Baez on Monday to secure a spot in the last 16 of the clay-court tournament.

## Klopp ready for 'punishment'

London: Liverpool boss Jurgen Klopp said he expects to be punished for his behaviour on the touchline during Sunday's 4-3 win over Tottenham Hotspur as well as for his post-match comments on referee Paul Tierney.

Klopp was handed a yellow card for celebrating Diego Jota's 94th-minute winner by running towards the fourth official John Brooks at Anfield, where the German also injured himself in the process.

After the game, Klopp accused referee Paul Tierney of having something "against" Liverpool but the referee's body PGMOL reviewed the audio of Tierney and said he

acted in a professional manner throughout.

"I probably have to expect the punishment because the referees think I questioned their integrity. But in the moment, I just described my feelings," Klopp told reporters on Tuesday.

"The whole situation shouldn't have happened at all. It was out of emotion, out of anger. That's why I celebrated the way I celebrated.

"I couldn't get close to the fourth official and I didn't want to get close to the fourth official, and then I pulled my muscle. I tried to calm down, it didn't work."

Klopp said he had not ex-

pected a red card but added that Tierney thought otherwise.

"I expected the yellow card and he said to me: 'For me it is a red card, but because of him (fourth official), it is yellow,' and he shows me a yellow and smiles in my face, that is it," he added.

"We won a football game in a spectacular manner and the only headlines were about me. I regret that."
